### Letter From Rabbi Feldman, Menahel



I'm honored to share this report with you - the partners who have made the dream of Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael possible.

This past year has been a challenging one for our community and the world. In spite of this challenge, Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael continues to grow.

Excelling in education even in times of adversity is something the Jewish people have learned throughout the millennia.

In 1941, Rabbi Dovid Dryan of Gateshead, England, had a vision: to establish a kollel in Gateshead. The timing could not have been more difficult. The world was becoming aware of the destruction taking place in Europe. The English feared a Nazi invasion, and were struggling with financial crisis, food shortages, and worry for their loved ones at the front and at home.

Rabbi Dryan sent letters to twenty leading Torah leaders across England. Nineteen of them ignored the letter. The twentieth, however, did not. Rabbi Eliyahu Dessler had evacuated to Chesham, England during those dark days. On October 10th, 1941, he came to Gateshead to accept the invitation and the challenge put forth by Rabbi Dryan. And so, the famed Gateshead Kollel was established.

Rabbi Dryan recognized the destruction of the Holocaust as a time to rebuild. Specifically when there are challenges, we need to be looking forward. In 2020, the rebbeim, teachers, parents, and students of Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael demonstrated a spirit of growth and tenacity in the context of a global pandemic, with a successful transition to an online learning experience. The students completed their curricula for the year despite the disruptions; throughout, they maintained their strong camaraderie with each other and the rebbeim.

The yeshiva is back to in-person learning, with a hybrid model of in-person and online studies. We now have a total enrollment of 43 students, including the largest 9th-grade class to date. We've expanded our academic program as well, and have appointed a Director of STEM to enhance our offerings.

To meet the growing needs of our school, we're in the midst of a \$4 million dollar expansion program, doubling the size of our current building. Expected completion is early 2021.

School spirit has remained strong because our vision remains unchanged: *Timeless Torah*, *Premier Academics*, *Sterling Character*.

Thank you for enabling this growth.

We hope we can continue our partnership with you in the year ahead.

### Letter From Dr. Peter Holland, Director of General Studies



For the past six years I have been privileged to work with Rabbi Feldman and the faculty and students at Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael. Taking a concept and translating it into a school that started with five students and now has over 40 students has been a dream come true for Rabbi Feldman and the Board of Trustees, and it has met

the needs of many parents who were seeking just such a high school for their sons.

Since 2014, YOY has offered a dual curriculum—a rigorous Judaic studies coupled with challenging college prep courses—that has filled a unique niche in the landscape of Jewish high schools in Boston. I have seen the faculty develop into a stable and accomplished group, who combine expertise in their disciplines with caring and concern for the boys they teach. YOY secular studies include four years of Mathematics, English, Social Studies, and Science; three years of Hebrew language studies; and two years of Computer Science and Business. I am pleased that our graduates are well prepared for their future study in yeshivas and universities. The YOY curriculum has expanded to include these five Advanced Placement courses: Physics C Mechanics, Calculus AB, Microeconomics, Macroeconomics, and United States History. Other special courses are Entrepreneurship, Topics in Biochemistry, and Statistics. The renovated and expanded school facility will provide greater support for the academic programs including more classrooms, a larger beis medrash, a science laboratory, faculty office space, a dedicated cafeteria area, and an outdoor basketball court.

As I prepare to take my leave and move into semiretirement. It has been my good fortune to meet Rabbi Feldman, the faculty, board, students and parents. You have been a large part of my life – which has included many years in Catholic and public schools – and I am deeply grateful for the opportunity to have played a part in the development of YOY and to meet so many dedicated supporters who are now friends. I look forward to visiting and seeing the school continue to grow.

# **BUILDING** A BRIGHT FUTURE

The 2019-2020 academic year was historic for Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael. At the end of 2019, the school embarked on an ambitious building expansion project that will double the square footage of the Yeshiva and create a spectacular environment in which our growing student body can thrive.

In addition to several classrooms, each fully-equipped with A/V technology and wifi, the new building will house a dedicated science lab, large communal lunchroom, student lounge, music room, and two outdoor basketball courts. There are also administrative offices and flex-spaces.

The crowning jewel of the Yeshiva expansion is a spectacular 80-person Beis Medrash filled with natural light and warmth from five distinctive skylight windows. Our windows, especially "The Connector Corridor" windows, overlook the historic Chestnut Hill Reservoir. These beautiful views will inspire our students to engage with their Creator through prayer, excel in their academics, and socialize with friends.

This investment in their future is an investment in the future of Jewish education in Boston. Passersby on Beacon Street will glimpse at Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael's elegant building and reflect with pride on what our community has achieved.

The project completion date is on target for March 2021.
