From the desk of

Rabbi Michael Shepard, Dean of Academics



In considering the move to Boston in the spring of last year, I was intrigued with the idea of Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael as Rabbi Feldman explained it. Now that I have been here for a year, the idea is not only borne out by its reality but is exceeded by it. There are not many yeshivos in America where students can get a first-rate chinuch in Limudei Kodosh while at the same time achieve in a fine college-preparatory general studies program with a tradition of excellence. It has been an honor for me to be here.

To perpetuate that tradition, general studies could boast of a program that prepared students for four Advanced Placement tests in US History, Calculus, Microeconomics, and Environmental Science. Next year, our intention is to add two more: English Language and Composition as well as Computer Science Principles. The latter course will determine the curriculum of our 9/10th grade computer classes and offer the chance to achieve three college credits at the end of 10th grade.

Besides the AP classes, we have established a relationship with Quincy College which will grant college credits for our courses in 11th grade biology and precalculus and 12th grade English composition and statistics. In total, we

will be offering courses totaling 30 college credits, equivalent to an entire year.

One change that will become a permanent feature of the curriculum is the introduction of Jewish history in the ninth, tenth, and twelfth grades. Next year, ninth graders will study the period from the Maccabees to the Gaonim, while the tenth grade will cover the experience of the Jews in Europe from the time of the Rishonim until the Enlightenment. The twelfth grade will pick up the story at the beginning of the 19th century and continue through the tumultuous 20th and 21st centuries.

Student council was established in the fall of 2021 to provide a formal channel of communications between students and administration. Two elected delegates from each grade met weekly at lunchtime with me to discuss both problems and proposals dealing with student life. The council served as a model of applied democracy and has provoked the interest of more students to run for office when the next delegates are chosen on Election Day in November.

We are proud of our students' accomplishments in all of their studies and look forward to an evolving reality of even greater growth and accomplishment next year.

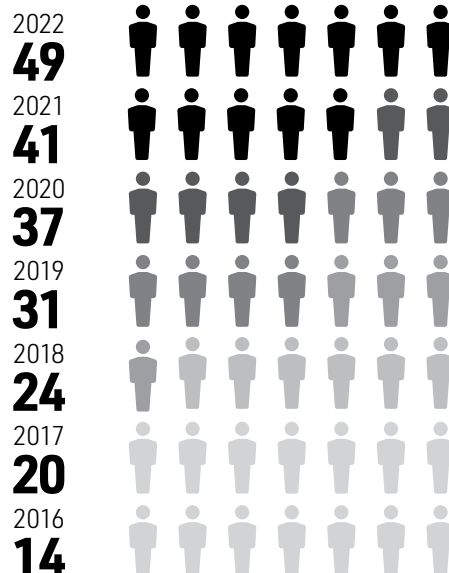
SIYUMIM

Graduating Class of 2022 (two seniors not pictured)

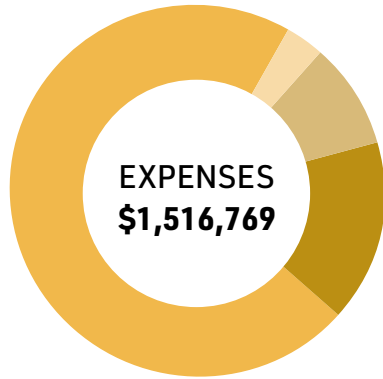
YEAR-OVER-YEAR ENROLLMENT GROWTH



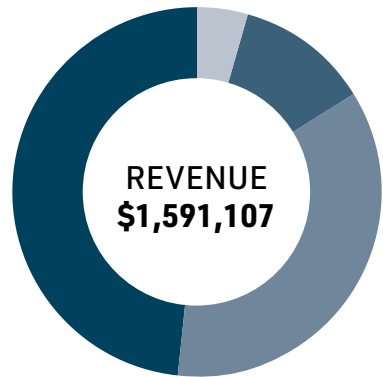

In April, 2022 Yeshiva Ohr Yisrael celebrated the chanukas habayis of its newly expanded building. The \$4.5 million renovation more than doubled the square footage of the yeshiva. Exciting features include a large beis medrash, science lab, sound-proof music room and a basketball court.
